

Schools of Choice 105c Policies & Regulations

- One application per student, per year may be submitted to one school district
- If more applications are received in a district than openings are available, there will be a random lottery drawing for all applications received prior to the deadline.
- According to the Michigan High School Athletic Association students accepted into the Schools of Choice program who are in grades 10 – 12 will not be eligible to participate in sports for one semester – until the second half of the school year.
- Accepted students must agree to comply with choice districts policies.
- Transportation is NOT provided for Schools of Choice students. Parents must provide their own transportation to and from school for children accepted for enrollment through the 105c Schools of Choice Plan.
- After you are accepted, you will be allowed continuous enrollment in that district until graduation or until you withdraw from that district at which time you may return to your resident district.
- Waiting lists will be created at choice districts after the lottery/random draw and parents will be notified if spaces become available.
- Siblings of students previously accepted under the Schools of Choice Program will be assigned to open spots before a random draw begins.
- If a child has an IEP for special education services, an agreement between the resident school district and the Schools of Choice district must be in place regarding the responsibility of funding the required services.
