



Recognizing Speech and Language Concerns Early

You may want to consider contacting a speech therapist if your child is demonstrating any of the following:

1. He is not talking by the age of two years old.
2. Her speech is not understood by other people after the age of three years old.
3. He uses mostly vowel sounds.
4. She is leaving off many beginning consonants after the age of three.
5. He is not using two- to three-word sentences by the age of three.
6. She is leaving off ending sounds of words after the age of five.
7. His sentence structure/grammar is noticeably wrong after the age of five.
8. She is stuttering frequently after the age of six.
9. His voice is too loud, too soft, too high-pitched, too low-pitched, or hoarse.
10. She is embarrassed or bothered by her speech.
