Common Questions and the Answers

What is Science Olympiad?

The Science Olympiad is an international nonprofit organization devoted to improving the quality of science education and increasing student interest in science and technology.

Translation: it's a fun way to enjoy science/technology with your friends and be competitive too!

What do students do as part of a Science Olympiad Team?

Students work on a team (with a partner) to compete in events in all areas of science, engineering and technology based on their skills and area(s) of expertise. Getting ready for competition depends on the student(s) and coach. Meetings can range from once to twice a week and take place after school for about 1 hour.

What is a tournament/competition like?

Competitions are like an academic track meet consisting of 23 events ranging from paper/pencil tests to lab stations to building a tower, bridge or car. A rule book containing information for each event is received by the team in advance so they can prepare for the events they will be competing in.

What is the main focus of Science Olympiad?

The focus is on knowledge and application of knowledge in the areas of Life, Earth and Physical

Sciences, Mechanical Engineering and/or Technology.

Translation: there are events that focus on all the areas of science you have studied and areas you haven't. If you like to build things...WE NEED YOU!

Bottom Line: If you like science, nature, building things, figuring things out, are curious and want to be competitive ...

Science Olympiad just might be for you!
